Cost Category	Eligible Costs	Examples of how to use this category
2) Administrative and Overhead Costs	<p>Administrative costs that are directly linked to and have been incurred for the initiative, such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Communication costs (e.g. long distance calls or faxes) • Permits or certifications required for the initiative • Printing or photocopying by outside suppliers • Acquisition of documents used exclusively for the initiative • Document translation • Transportation, shipping and courier costs for delivery of materials and services essential for the initiative • Advertising costs essential to communicating the initiative to the public such as website development, public surveys, advertising development and media distribution 	<p>Esri-hosted ArcGIS Open Data gives you a quick way to set up public-facing websites where you can communicate your initiative(s) to the public, provide a means to listen to the public, monitor your progress and fully engage with all stakeholders. It also provides a means for you store all your documents, data and information about your initiative so the public can easily find and download your data and information in a variety of open formats.</p>
4) Capital	<p>Specialized system hardware</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Software costs up to a maximum of \$25,000 will be accepted, unless otherwise approved by FCM • For Demonstration Projects only: rental or purchase of equipment essential for conducting the small-scale activity. This would include construction costs, materials, renovation and modernization costs, and installations costs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Collector for ArcGIS: Inventory Collection - collect and update information in the field. • Operations Dashboard for ArcGIS: Asset Analytics - monitor activities and events, track your field workforce and assess the status and performance of your daily operations. • Cityworks: Asset/Maintenance Management - leverage your GIS and manage capital assets and infrastructure.
7) Meetings and public gatherings	<p>Costs related to meetings and public gatherings that communicate the initiative to the public and that collect feedback, such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facility rental • Audiovisual equipment 	<p>Use ArcGIS Online Templates for Public Hearings or Open Data to communicate your initiative to the public and collect feedback in an effective and modern way.</p>
8) Services	<p>Fees for professional or technical consultants and contractors</p>	<p>Esri Canada training and consulting fees for implementing solutions such as Prince George’s GIS-Centric Asset Management Solution or other examples mentioned in the blog</p>
9) Staff salaries	<p>Direct staff time working on the initiative, with supporting timesheets</p>	<p>Staff time working with Esri Canada personnel on implementing solutions</p>
